Feds Arrest Man Behind 'South Park' Threats

The online poster who reportedly threatened the animated comedy's creators is now under arrest for allegedly supporting a foreign terrorist group.

Federal authorities in Virginia have arrested the man who allegedly wrote online posts threatening the creators of *South Park* after the show ran an episode that included the Prophet Muhammad. The Justice Department announced the arrest of 20-year-old Zachary Chesser Wednesday, saying authorities had stopped him at a New York airport on July 10 before he made a planned trip to Somalia to allegedly try to join an Islamic militant group.

The Justice Department said in a press release that Chesser admitted to using "several online profiles dedicated to extremist jihad propaganda." One of those profiles was Abu Talha al-Amrikee, the poster who threatened *South Park* creators Trey Parker and Matt Stone in April after an episode that made fun of religious figures, including Muhammad, says a law-enforcement official who spoke on condition of anonymity. The posts, made on RevolutionMuslim.com, encouraged readers to "pay Comedy Central a visit," listed addresses of the television network's New York offices, and said Parker and Stone "will probably wind up like Theo Van Gogh for airing this show." Van Gogh was a Dutch filmmaker killed by an Islamic militant in 2004 after he produced a controversial film that criticized Islam for demeaning women.

When authorities arrested Chesser at the airport, he had his infant son in tow, allegedly in an effort to stay under the radar. He was reportedly planning to travel from New York to Uganda and then to Somalia, where he would join [Al-Shabab](#), the militant group with ties to Al Qaeda that has claimed responsibility for a pair of coordinated bombings in the Ugandan capital during the World Cup final that killed scores of people. Those bombings occurred on July 11, one day after Chesser was prevented from boarding the plane.

"This case exposes the disturbing reality that extreme radicalization can happen anywhere, including Northern Virginia," said U.S. Attorney Neil H. MacBride in a press release. "This young man is accused of seeking to join Al-Shabab, a brutal terrorist organization with ties to Al Qaeda. These allegations underscore the need for continued vigilance against homegrown terror threats."

Declassified [first reported](#) Chesser's ties to the *South Park* threats in April, when New York police were stepping up security at Comedy Central's headquarters, fearing that the online posts might incite violence. Chesser's alleged posts also include "an article detailing the prerequisites involved in leaving for jihad, which closely follows the steps Chesser took" before trying to join Al-Shabab and fight in Somalia, according to the Justice Department.

Chesser's online history includes numerous posts to a variety of blogs, Web sites and social networking sites. Among them is the Revolution Muslim (RM) Web site, on which Chesser is a contributor and has posted jihadist propaganda. For example, after the March 2010 subway bombings in Moscow, which killed at least 40 people and wounded 60 others, Chesser praised the two female suicide bombers.

During an online discussion run by RM in February 2010, Chesser wrote: "May Allah blow up the Jews and the Rawaafidh [shi'a]." Chesser, who appears to be an emerging member of the group, has indicated that he is seeking people to help him start a RM chapter in D.C., closer to his apparent home in Virginia. In an email reportedly sent to Foxnews, Chesser wrote that he writes for RM to raise awareness of "key Islamic beliefs." He said in the email that "peace come[s] with the following conditions: a complete withdrawal of non-Muslim forces from Muslim lands, an ending of the propping up of the apartheid regime of Israel..." Chesser also warned, "If you kill us, then we kill you."

Chesser has also posted on a Web site run by Samir Khan, a North Carolina-based blogger who also distributes jihadist propaganda.

In addition to extremist sites, Chesser uses mainstream social networking sites, like Facebook and YouTube, to post many of his comments and materials. In April 2010, administrators disabled his Facebook account, according to his wife.

The following is a sampling of Chesser's recent posts on a variety of sites:

Al Faloja Forum

Chesser posts to Al Faloja forum, an Islamic message board that contains terrorist propaganda, including various terrorist videos and user comments expressing support for terrorist groups and their activity. In a June 2010 post, Chesser encourages a campaign of fake attacks, for instance leaving an abandoned car in Times Square or a bag near the White House, which will desensitize the public and law enforcement and "would be of great help to the mujahidiin." He ends his post by saying, "A cop might walk up to a bag that someone thought might be a bomb, so he assumes it is not. Then he bends over to open it rolling his eyes at this waste of his time. Boom! No more kaafir [non-Muslim]."

Al Qimmah Forum

Chesser frequently contributes to the English section of Al Qimmah forum, a predominantly Somali and Arabic message board. In June 2010, Chesser wrote and recorded an English song which he posted on the forum. In the song, titled "So Work Hard O Soldier," he sings, "Our goals are only two... Victory or death, from the first drop of life's blood, until the final breath. They call me 'irhaabi,' [terrorist] for supporting mujahidun. So if jihad is irhaab [terrorism], then nahnu irhaabiyun [we are terrorists]."

7th Century Generation Forum

Chesser's posts to the 7th Century Generation forum, an Islamic message board dedicated to various topics relating to Islam, includes various terrorist videos and comments about current events. Chesser described the May 2010 attack carried out against Swedish cartoonist Lars Vilks as "Correcting an evil with your hand..." Vilks has been targeted for his depictions of the Prophet Muhammad as a dog in a Swedish newspaper in 2007.

In another post on February 28, 2010, Chesser expressed support for the mujahideen, saying "Allah grant them a quick and obvious victory over the munafiqeen [hypocrites] and the innovators. Allah provide for the families of the martyrs... Guide us to be among the mujahideen and grant us martyrdom in Your Path."

Islamic Emirate Forum

Chesser's contributions to the Islamic Emirate forum, a message board for Muslims to "serve Allah by uniting," include an April 2010 post calling several countries "clear enemies," including America, Israel and the United Kingdom. He also posted an entry arguing that "The issue of killing someone without going to a Qadee [judge] is correct in the situation of one who insults the Messenger of Allah." This entry was posted on April 13, 2010, the day before an episode aired on South Park that satirized issues surrounding the depiction of the Prophet Muhammad.

Islamic Awakening Forum

Chesser has used several accounts on the Islamic Awakening forum, an Islamic forum dedicated to various topics relating to Islam. In a December 2009 post, Chesser expressed support for the September 11 hijackers, saying "Why does every Muslim desire that 9-11 be an inside job, when if it is not it means that 20+ Muslims will get the reward for fighting jihad." In another post in the same thread, Chesser justified the attack, saying "Collateral damage is allowed. The WTC, the Pentagon, and the White House are all military targets regardless of whether or not they had civilians in them."

YouTube – AQWAHProductions Channel

Chesser maintains a YouTube channel under the name "AQWAHProductions," where he posts numerous terrorist videos and praises the mujahideen who have been killed around the world.

Chesser's former YouTube channel, "Al Quran wa al-Ahadeeth," which was suspended in May 2010, contained similar videos, including English translations of Arabic sermons. One of these sermons, titled "The Permissibility of Self-Sacrificial Operations" by Shaykh Yousuf Al-Uyayri, tells Muslims that in order to expel Jews from Israel, "the best treatment and the greatest medicine that we apply to the brothers of monkeys and pigs (i.e. the Jews) is that we perform these martyrdom operations."

Chesser also posts comments to other YouTube channels. In April 2009, in response to a video of a speech by Israeli diplomat Mark Regev, he commented: "Ya Allaah! Destroy

this vile nation... we will crush these vile devils like bugs."

The Mujahid Blog

Chesser's Mujahid Blog, "dedicated to those who give their lives for this religion," includes both original materials as well as reposts of various terrorist propaganda.

In a March 21, 2010, post titled "Counter Counter Terrorism #1," Chesser gives instructions on how to counter counterterrorism efforts and proposes advertising the successes of the mujahideen with a "clear bias." He suggests using terms like "5 Western pigs sent to Hellfire in sha'a Allah," when talking about non-Muslims who have been killed.

The Mujahid blog, operated by wordpress, also has a forum that allows others to post materials. In a January 25, 2010, post to this forum, he identified his full name as "Zachary A Chesser." He also said, "I am a revert to Islam and I was a student at George Mason University. Feel free to go to GMU's [Muslim Student Association] page on facebook and ask them about me if you are seriously worried about that."

The Mujahid blog appears to have been suspended by wordpress on April 22 for violation of terms of service.

Youtube Jihad Blog

The Youtube Jihad Blog consists of Chesser and five other contributors. The contributors – who post videos containing fatwas, lectures, nasheeds (Islamic songs) and other materials – also operate YouTube channels that include the same videos. One video posted by Chesser on February 22, 2010, titled "America Tuta Fika," shows several militants pointing their guns at the screen as Chesser sings "America, America, America here we come, we come to please our lord, and jihad is all we know."

Facebook

Chesser's Facebook profile, which was disabled in April, included many of the same videos, sermons and other materials that he posts on his blogs. For example, Chesser posted dozens of sermons by Anwar al-Awlaki. His wife reposted the majority of these materials on her Facebook profile as well.

Twitter

Chesser has two Twitter accounts, one under the name Mujahid Blog and the other under his alias Abu Talhah. He uses his accounts to direct followers to the materials he posts elsewhere online and to make other statements. On March 22, 2010 he tweeted: "United States still the slave of Israel. Hillary Clinton declares relationship with the genocidal regime 'Rock solid.'" Both Twitter accounts have been deactivated.

Scribd

Chesser's scribd account is filled with various extremist documents. One document that he wrote in conjunction with Younus Abdullah Muhammad, a spokesperson for Revolution Muslim, is an article that refutes a West Point study claiming that Al Qaeda kills mostly Muslims. The Scribd account has been deactivated.

Of course we feel for the families of those locked up as prisoners under man-made laws, and we should do whatever we can to help bring them some relief.

However to say that they should've done this or that we could do that to avoid being captured by the kuffar and being held as prisoners is a great sin, especially when speaking of those brothers and sisters who wind up imprisoned for speaking the truth, supporting the truth, or attempting to help their brothers and sisters in Islam by fulfilling their obligations in the Deen.

Fearing anything else as Allah Ta'alaah should be feared is a great sin. Loving this life, even if it be our children, wives, homes, or wealth as we should love Allah Ta'alaah is a great sin.

Everyone will only say as much of the truth as Allah Ta'alaah wills and everyone will be rewarded according to his intention.

To say that Muslims did not openly declare their Islam at the beginning of Islam is not an example for us so that we believe that to be preferable to those who declare it openly and suffer the consequences of that, rather it is a rukhsah for those who truly are under hardship for simply proclaiming they are Muslim.

Everyone makes their own choice whether to speak or remain quiet, and there can be no doubt that the ones who are most firm in their beliefs will speak out even if it brings them harm, whereas those of weaker faith will remain quiet, and those of no faith will use the harm that comes to those who speak out to instill fear in others instead of using their examples as examples of those of strong faith.

The families must believe and have faith that the prisoners who are there for speaking or acting upon the truth are in the path of Allah Ta'alaah as long as they are imprisoned and until Allah Ta'alaah decides to release them.

And we must not forget that the Prophet SAWS said: "The best Jihad is a word of truth to a tyrannical authority"...

So do we have to be in the battlefield clashing swords or shooting guns? No.

Is it correct to put down people on account that they are a part of supporting the truth in word only? Never.

But let's not confuse things for a moment- the one who openly proclaims his Islam and suffers for that is better than the one who is quiet. The one who fights with his limbs is better than the one who fights with his tongue.

So at least show that you have some faith in your heart by not putting down those who support Islam with their tongues or limbs, and show that you have some backbone by not saying and doing things that only serve to spread fear among the communities of Muslims in the west who are among the few who do try to support Islam with their tongues.

That is how I see IA- many brothers and sisters come here not only to socialize, but to spread knowledge and good will, and to be apart of Islam spreading and upholding the truth. If online activity was not real or not important, then people would not be going to jail for what they say online.

Do I want to go to jail? Of course not, as much as I don't want any of my brothers and sisters locked up, especially not for supporting Islam and Muslims. Is every person who is locked up a hero? No. But in Islam our brothers and sisters do not deserve to be locked up by kuffar or held accountable according to their laws.

One of the most insidious and asinine things a person can do is take the calamity of a Muslim and say the likes of 'I told you so', and then wag their finger at other people.

Sorry Akh Abu Treika, but some of the above just had to be said, and if it is directly or indirectly

Despite the fact that this is an absolutely fraudulent representation of what happened with the FBI, it is apparent to me that my business IS your "business and interest."

For example, once Abu Talha was arrested you posted this, "The feds say on CNN that all is recorded by court ordered electronic surveillance, so the Sheikh/Emir/Director/Emam/Brother can not claim they have not been warned and the true nature of those driving the young brothers to Club Fed will eventually be public knowledge by the government."

This is a referral to myself and is suggesting that I incited the brother which would make me a criminal in violation of U.S. law and therefore incarcerated and away from my family. This is exactly what you aim to achieve, a little push for the authorities because you are upset you have yet to read the headline of my arrest.

Similarly, today you went on a very poorly expressed rant on your blog that says,

"If one wishes to see how a once regular IA type Muslim becomes radicalized and played like Zach Chesser was follow all posts by Abu Najm Muhammad here from the beginning and then notice the change as he was "given a platform" at RM and then later Authentic Tawheed as RM is faded out after the arrest of at least 3 brothers by a fearless leader behind a kunya that has nothing to lose. Simply make RM a "Ummah News" site and move on to Islamic Finance, it won't effect his academic ivy league degree, job or family simply because that is not his name absolute zero accountability. This is clearly another attempt by you to incarcerate me, or help those trying to do so, on the basis that I am getting other brothers arrested and then planning on disappearing without accountability.

Essentially you are trying to play a role in my arrest as an incitor. I emailed you and explained that you had no evidence that I have ever incited or told people to commit acts of violence and that my position on terrorism is that I neither condemn it nor condone it, yet you still slander and accuse on speculation with no evidence. I even informed you that what you were suspecting was not true, but you don't care because it is good for your platform even though the Jawa Report and FBI, both of whom you deeply respect read these blogs and call every day for my incarceration while knowing my birth name, address and personal information. So, what is apparent is that you are seeking my destruction and incarceration, my demise and catastrophe to my household because I am "salafi jihadi" and consider Qaradawi a pawn of the Sovereign Slush Funds and an enemy of the Mujahideen. I suppose, I feel that Qaradawi is, in fact, the only one providing "pseudo-academic Islamic dalel."

Truth be told, I had many conversations with Abu Talha about the platform for spreading Islam. He felt that some of what I was saying was passive to a degree and moved on. I have not been in contact with him for several months and he has not been participating on RM since the South Park Affair, yet you insinuate that I am recorded inciting the brother and on my way to the slammer. Don't say I didn't warn you, save your lectures for the people that accept your anonymous bravery. Please don't email me or contact me. I have so much more to say but I do have self control."

So, you are desiring that the Jawas start harassing me, that the authorities monitor me and that I am put under scrutiny and as one of the only people here that is speaking the truth, and that does not include calling for terrorism, the real fallacy is that you provide no evidence of me saying anything wrong or doing something that would incite and effect another's household.

I need to emphasize that the position of RM is that the jihadi movement will require a comprehensive and paradigmatic effort. We emphasize repeatedly that the role of the Muslim is to desire jihad, defend the mujahideen, and understand the fiqh of jihad, but that another way they can contribute to the efforts to establish Islam is to understand the dynamics of the contemporary socio-economic, political order and thereby try to concoct Islamic solutions, understanding the beauty of the shariah and thus really understanding how to reject the taghout. Yousef wrote nothing other than some very barbaric posts that plague us today, never, ever knew Shaikh Faisal until I introduced him, never wrote an article but would post them here so that all would think it was he who wrote them and then spent months talking as if he and Faisal were personal confidantes, which was never true. After working with him for years, and allowing him to call to his own fame despite me doing all the real work, I only kicked him off RM after he adopted this confrontational, Ikhwani platform and I speak on behalf of the mujahideen to the best of my ability and do not call to misguidance.

I do not have time for forum chatter. And I expect many here to try to come to his defense. I am deeply saddened by Abu Talha's arrest. I wish things were different, but your suggestion that you are only on here ranting because you care about the ummah and the families and children is bull. You don't care about the ummah's families when the African Union forces fire indiscriminately into Mogadishu because you are so-too praying and working for the destruction of the Shabaab. Likewise, you are using this event to call to yourself, to engage in a series of "I told you so's." To me, that is sickening and I hope that Allah (swt) changes your condition and protects me from your evil intention.

I hope others get my drift, this is as much about the ummah as it is about me. Please heed, buyer beware!

By the way the speech of Abu Talha has nothing to do with his indictment. It was an admission and I am sure there was more to it than just the surface of the conversation included in the FBI statement. Be careful to allow this to pressure you to stay silent, we must continue talking about the reality of their War on Islam.
